Matsakis (2017)

RADDLE.ME

- Raddle.me is an anarchy-based online community
 - Hosts 25+ forums
 - Reddit alternative, formed after ban of r/LeftWithSharpEdge in 2010
- Free and open-source coding
 - No advertisements
 - No user tracking
 - No analytics

Matsakis (2017)





"Forum focused on the anti-capitalist practice of law-breaking."

- 2,707 subscribers, 5,300 submissions
- Information sharing, advice seeking, and AMAs
 - X No capitalists or police-apologists
 - X No bigotry
 - X No class traitors

- X Avoid moralizing
- No solicitating personal info
- X No buying or selling



INFORMATION SHARING

RETAIL THEFT MASTER LIST

- Retail chains are ranked from 1 to 10 based on how easy they are to "rip off"
 - 91 American chains, 5 Canadian, and 3 from UK
 - Based on 5 metrics

SHOPLIFTING GUIDE QUADRILOGY

- Step-by-step guide to successful lifting, divided into:
 - Beginner: no previous lifting experience
 - Intermediate: 3+ successful lifts totaling at least \$25
 - Advanced: 30+ successful lifts totaling at least half your state's felony threshold
 - **Professional**: in progress

 - Purchasing and lifting detachers










ADVICE SEEKING

TUMBLR (t)

- Tumblr is a microblogging website with 37 million monthly visits
- Home to the "Liftblr" community, where users gather to:
 - Post "hauls"
 - Share tips, tricks, and advice
 - Share jokes and memes





LIFTBLR "HAULS"

- Users share aesthetic photos and details of their lifts
 - Often referred to as "hauls" or "savings"
 - Other refer to themselves as "role-playing", "research", or "lift-play"
 blogs

 Many users keep a running total of their "hauls" in their blog descriptions

TIPS AND TRICKS

 Like Raddle, users circulate master lists of different retail chains and share advice on successful lifting

- Websites to boost stolen merchandise
- Hiding metadata on "haul" pictures

- Tag identification and removal
- Lifting tactics

NAVIGATING THESE SITES

- Users often change the spelling of brands or use acronyms to avoid keyword searches:
 - W@lm@rt
 - Victoria Sëcret/PÏNK
 - HD
- Others use keywords or slang:
 - "Liftshopping"
 - "Hauls" or "savings"

- Taggs, Detacherss
- \$ Gen
- Wh0l3 F00d\$

- "Thrifting"
- "Klepto"



TESTING THE BLOGGERS

- Users often share information on various "defeat" technologies
- The LPRC sought understand the effectiveness of some of these technologies:



RFID-Blocking Fabric



Facial Recognition Blocking Shirt



Facial Recognition Blocking Hoodie



FARADAY FABRIC

 An LPRC Researcher tested the effectiveness of the RFID-blocking fabric, specifically using RFID test strips

 Test results found that the faraday fabric successfully blocks the RFID pedestals

Inexpensive and readily available online







FACIAL RECOGNITION SHIRT

- The LPRC Research Team took turns walking in and out of our facial recognition-equipped lab
 - Did the system capture our faces?
 - Did the system recognize our faces?

 Test results found that the shirts did not successfully block the facial recognition technology





FACIAL RECOGNITION HOODIES


- The LPRC Research Team tested two different facial recognition blocking hoodies by walking in an out of the lab space
- The hoodies have a two-fold purpose:
 - 1. To defeat license plate readers by overloading the system
 - 2. To defeat facial recognition by confusing humans as passing cars






FACIAL RECOGNITION HOODIES

- Overall, the hoodies themselves did not successfully defeat the facial recognition system
 - Notably, the cameras only sporadically identified faces when the hoods were up







TAKEAWAYS

- 1. Offenders are using social media to share information and exploit your weaknesses
 - The good news? You can use these sites too!
 - Understand offender perceptions of your stores
 - *Identify effective deterrents*
 - Let them find your weaknesses so you can continue to improve
 - Stay ahead of new defeat devices
 - Other channels are used as well (Discord, Facebook, WhatsApp, Snapchat, Twitter, Instagram etc.)



TAKEAWAYS

- 2. Some deviant or disgruntled employees are sharing store information to help the offenders
 - Pre-employment screening can be used to identify reliable and loyal employees
 - Routine monitoring of these sites is important to ensure store and organization security
 - Can be used to identify current or former employees sharing organization informtion
- 3. Regardless of the effectiveness of defeat devices, they can be an easy way for LP/AP to identify potential offenders
